Should you decide to inform the college not to release any or all of this directory information any future requests for such information will be refused.

Cox College will honor your request to withhold "directory information" but will not assume responsibility to contact you for subsequent permission to release it. Regardless of the effect upon you, the college assumes no liability for honoring your instructions that such information be withheld.

It is the policy of Cox College not to release any information about a student over the telephone.

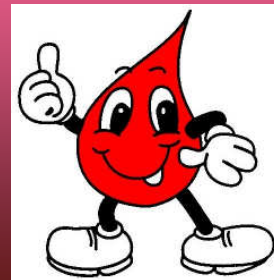
Tutors Needed!!

We have another scholarship opportunity. The Springfield News-Leader is sponsoring two scholarships for area nursing students. 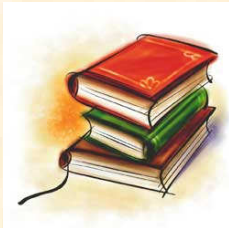

New Dosage Calculation Policy!

Beginning with the Spring 2010 **semester dosage calculation tests will be offered twice instead of three times.** This impacts everyone in the nursing programs that are required to take dosage calculation competency tests. To further clarify, here is an example: If you take the first test and do not pass, you may test a second time. If you do not pass that test, you must then take the dosage calculation remediation course if you are eligible. Eligibility includes anyone who has not already taken the course. To advance to the next nursing course, you must pass the course. Failure to pass dosage calculation remediation or failure to pass dosage calculation tests within the two-try limit after having completed the remediation course will result in failure from the nursing program.

To ensure your success, practice tests are offered on the Web site, and there are multiple resources available in the library to help you practice. It is highly recommended that you practice dosage calculation prior to taking the first test.

Testing dates and times will be posted as usual in advance of the testing period.
